Research Results from 300 North Carolina Businesses Support Family-Friendly Policies

Family Forward NC sets goals to improve children's well-being and give businesses a competitive edge

Raleigh, NC – North Carolina employers and employees agree that family-friendly policies help businesses retain talent and keep North Carolina businesses strong. The findings are based on interviews with more than 300 North Carolina employers and surveys with 300 employees from small, medium and large businesses across a wide range of industries that are the backbone of North Carolina's economy. **The findings will be released at the 2018 Institute for Emerging Issues Forum on Monday, February 5. (Details below.)**

The research was commissioned by the [NC Early Childhood Foundation](#) (NCECF) and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina (Blue Cross NC) as part of a new effort, Family Forward NC. Family Forward NC is a business initiative to improve children's health and well-being and keep North Carolina's businesses competitive. As founding sponsor, Blue Cross NC has recently invested \$475,000 to launch the initiative as part of its mission to improve the health and well-being of its customers and communities.

Family-friendly workplaces help children build a strong foundation for future academic and career success through improved access to high-quality health care, education and family economic security. NCECF's research explores a variety of practices and policies that benefit children and families – and have a positive impact on business – including flexible schedules, lactation support and paid parental leave.

NC Workforce Outlook

Employers in North Carolina face growing challenges in hiring qualified workers due to a skills gap. By 2020 – an estimated 67 percent of jobs in North Carolina will require post-secondary education. Only 45.9 percent of North Carolinians have that level of education today, according to a study on job growth by Georgetown University. Family-friendly workplaces make businesses competitive in hiring and retaining qualified workers.

Family Forward NC Research

Highlights from the research findings include:

- 71 percent of North Carolina employers think that family-friendly policies have a positive impact on their organization.
- Almost half of North Carolina employers plan on offering more family-friendly benefits in the coming year.
- 94 percent of employees say that family-friendly policies help business attract and retain talent – and keep companies strong.
- Most employers and employees say that flexible work hours are an important benefit for employers to offer.
