Be a Summer Learning Ambassador!

Children work hard in school and they learn a lot. Despite that work, children can lose what they learn over the summer. When that happens, they come back to school behind and it's hard to catch up. We can prevent this—here's how!

Summer program providers can play an important and trusted role in supporting parents to help summer be both a vacation from school *and* an opportunity for learning. With just a few easy steps and this summer learning toolkit, YOU can help make it possible for every child to succeed.

DID YOU KNOW?

According to the National Summer Learning Association:

- Most students **lose two months** of math skills every summer, and children from low-income families typically lose another two to three months in reading.
- Summer learning loss during elementary school accounts for **two-thirds of the achievement gap in reading** between children from low-income families and their peers from middle-income families by ninth grade.
- Nine in ten teachers spend at least three weeks re-teaching lessons when school starts.

TAKE ACTION

We can prevent summer learning loss by encouraging parents to read and talk with their children over summer break. This will help students be ready to learn what's next in school! We asked parents what messages would be most helpful to families when we created this toolkit.

It's easy to be a Summer Learning Ambassador! This toolkit contains everything you need to communicate with parents during drop-off and pick-ups, through text messaging and other ways your organization keeps in touch with parents over the summer.



How to Use This Toolkit
